Henri Nouwen, in his book "Bread for the Journey" writes—"It is possible for us as mature Christians to resist the temptation of 'there is no hope', but rather stand tall with self-confidence—never losing ground, always aware that 'earth and sky will pass away' but the words of Jesus will never pass away." (Luke 21:33).

With those thoughts in mind I refer to a passage in Revelation 21:5 "And the one who is seated on the throne said, 'See I am making all things new." Message from the Finance Team

"You cannot serve God and wealth"

Luke 16; 11 says "If then you have not been faithful with the dishonest wealth, who will entrust to you the true riches? How do we use the gifts God has blessed us with? These are the things we each have to think about as we approach the time to decide on our pledge for 2023. I know that some folks don't like to be held to a pledge. But if we think about this being a responsibility to be good stewards of those things that are God has bestowed on us. In October we will be asked to turn in a pledge form. Now is the time to begin to look into our hearts and have a conversation with God as to what is our responsibility as a steward of the things we have.

The month of July yielded the following. The Current and Loose income totaled **\$9,609** and our expenses totaled **\$9,021** – plus principal payment on the mortgage of \$2,470. This gives us a deficit of (\$1,885) for the month. Our expenses for the month were over budget by \$857, and our Current and Loose offerings were over budget by \$1,276. The Childcare tuition income was \$2,727 over budget for the month. The expenses for the month were \$569 over budget.

Community Garden 2022

This year there has been a very good harvest from the many plants in the community garden. We have picked over 2,300 pounds of vegetables compared to 1,450 for the entire season last year. Most of the produce has been taken to the food pantry at Grace Lutheran, except for some picked up by Christ Community members at our Monday or Thursday harvest times. There has been \$532 contributed to ELCA World Hunger during this growing season.

The garden will be closed out on the evening of Wednesday, October 5th, when the confirmation class from Grace Lutheran will come to the garden and pull out all the remaining plants. They will load them into a trailer to be taken to the Bellevue yard recycling center. If anyone would like to watch a half hour of busy activity by these youth, stop by at about 6:45 that night. The youth will be working at night with portable lighting.

God's Work Our Hands Sunday September 11



On September 11, we completed our collection of items for needy children at MacAuliffe School. We had 17 pairs of sweat pants and 300 individual packs of snack items. These were the items requested by the school principal.
